With the popularity of rustic themed weddings and DIY savvy brides, paper flowers are a big trend in the wedding business. More and more I see brides with bouquets of paper flowers. I wanted to try my hand at a unique homemade paper bouquet that would appeal to any DIY bride. Why take your time to make this bouquet? It's cheap: I probably make this whole bouquet for less than \$1.00. Average floral bouquets go for about \$30- \$80 a piece! This is easy to do: once you get to hang making flowers it takes several hours to make a full bouquet, depending on how many flowers you want in it. They are beautiful: Your guests will love their creative style as they show off their bouquet at the wedding. Next do: left foot, right hand, left hand, etc. LSee Music Sheet (Vendor's Site) Most of the sheet music found today was produced from the 1890s onwards. Early examples feature favorite songs from popular stage productions. Later, movies and radio introduced popular music in even more American homes. Performers associated with the original versions of these songs are often featured on the cover of the music, a side benefit for today's collector as a crossover in pop culture memorabilia. This type of ephemera was so in demand back in its day that many examples sold more than a million copies when they were first released. Gene Utz's paper collection (Collector Books – now from print, available through second-hand bookstores) reports that The Gilded Cage Bird sold two million copies in 1900. In 1910, the famous songs Let Me Call You Sweetheart and Down By the Old Mill Stream sold staggering amounts of five to six million copies each. Every professional musician of the day would have stacks of colorful sheet music hidden in piano benches and tucked into boxes. Amateur musicians patronized retailers selling sheet music for use and in homepun entertainment, especially during the holidays. The faces of early 20th-century personalities like Al Jolson, Fannie Brica and Eddie Cantor adorned many early questions with notes. Later, stars in the 1940s like Bing Crosby and Dorothy Lamour thrilled fans on colorfully illustrated front pages. Today, even the beatles' sheet music, The Beach Boys and other newer issues with pop culture icons, such as Michael Jackson, are being collected. More recognizable stars and songs usually have the greatest value with a few exceptions for rarity or attractive illustrations of machinations. Competition is not extremely fierce for this ephemeralia since there are plenty of song titles, but there are some cases of crossover collecting when it comes to sheet music. For example, military-themed pieces often interest militaria collectors, also known as military collectibles. Broadway music enthusiasts will be looking for a number of titles from both Rodgers and Hammerstein or Irving Berlin. Collectors of sports memorabilia look for music with illustrations with baseball heroes yesteryear. As an example, The Climber's Rag with cameo illustrations by the St. Louis Cardinals baseball team from 1911. Other buyers are attracted by numerous covers with colorful drawings of beautiful women. Framed and hung on a wall, it can make a nice accent in a home or office that most can appreciate. Due to the volume produced and distributed as specified although they are made of paper and can be somewhat fragile as they age, only a few examples of sheet music are really rare. The most common examples are sold in the range of \$3 to \$5 today in antique centers, and sometimes for even less through online auctions. For example, it's not uncommon to find lots of 25 to 30 pieces of sheet music sold online for \$10 or less for an entire lot. The most common pieces must be in excellent condition to bring even so much. However, many parts of Scott Joplin's work bring high prices, so it's wise to thoroughly explore the parts you can own before offering them for sale or like them in the donation bin. For example, Joplin's The Chrysanthemum could fetch more than \$1,000, with many of his other works with notes selling for \$500 or more. Music pieces that fall into the Black American category are also highly appreciated when they are in very good to excellent condition. A 1901 copy of Mose Gumble's The Hoogie Boogie Dance sold on eBay.com for \$1,400 in 2016. When signed by celebrities, the usual pieces of sheet music can also jump exponentially in value because autograph collectors are in the running for both those. And while they are not often found, examples of sheet music dating back to the early 1800s can also be valuable. These are usually simple sheets of handwritten music recorded on paper before mass printing occurs. They are illustration-free and very simple in appearance, but again, it is wise to explore what you have before stoning one of these rare items. You may have a treasure, even if it doesn't look like much. Sheet music is the format in which songs are recorded. The sheet music begins with blank paper from the music staff consisting of graphs that have five lines and four spaces, each representing a note. Songwriters who compose songs in a standard musical note use personnel paper to create sheet music, which can then be transferred to musicians interpreting the note for musical performance. Today, making your own sheet music easier than ever. With notation software like Finale or free Web service Noteflight, anyone can turn their music ideas into professional music sheets. Use Noteflight to get started (see Resources). Noteflight is a free web-based music logging service that lets you write, print, and even save sheet music as music files to play. Noteflight has a clean, easy-to-use interface that allows even a beginner to create a song in notes. Since Noteflight allows you to listen to what you've written, you can experiment with different notes until you create something that sounds good, even if you're unfamiliar with the musical composition. Create a Noteflight account and sign in to start creating sheet music. You can start writing your song right away. At the top of the page, located on the tool, click New Result to create note document. Choose whether you want your note private or shared. Shared, presents you with a blank music sheet in key C with a 4/4 time signature. Click Edit Title at the top of the sheet music and type a name for the song, and then click Edit Composer and type your name. Make any changes necessary for your key signature or time signature on the Score menu with the Change Time or Change Key Signature command. Add notes and leftovers to your note by clicking on the empty music staff. A headhead appears, and you can drag and click where you want the note to appear. You can also use a floating palette to select different lengths of notes. As you place your notes, Noteflight automatically recasts your sheet music to keep the right number of beats on the bar. To listen to what you've written at any time, go to the Play menu and select the playback option you want. Print the sheet music when you're done composing the song. The result will be the professional result of your song composition. You can also use Noteflight to record an audio file of a composition. Noteflight allows you to assign actual instrument sounds to the appropriate parts. Go to File and select Export to save ready-made sheet music as an MP3 or wav file. This allows you to take an example of recording into your band. Band.
